- Working knowledge of the Environmental Assessment Act, the Municipal Act, the Drainage Act, the Local Improvement Act, the Conservation Authorities Act, the Fisheries Act and other relevant legislation as well as demonstrated judgement and ability to critically assess options within the context of applicable legislation and Municipal polities to guide decisions.
